Civil Servants Cautioned Not To Spread Inaccurate Information On Missing MAS Plane

KLUANG, March 18 (Bernama) – Civil servants in the country have been cautioned not to spread inaccurate information on the missing Malaysia Airlines (MAS) flight to prevent confusion.

The Public Services Department (PSD) Director-General Tan Sri Mohamad Zabidi Zainal said a directive had been issued to about 1.4 million civil servants cautioning them to refrain from spreading inaccurate information or speculating about MH370.

"There are many parties, especially Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak and Acting Transport Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Hussein, who have repeatedly advised on this matter. So, I would like civil servants to be the nation's first line of defence by not adding fuel to fire," he said.

Mohamad Zabidi was speaking to reporters after launching the Young Leaders Transformation Discourse at the southern region Institute of Public Administration (INTAN) here Tuesday.

He said that as future leaders, civil servants, particularly the younger generation, should be loyal to the nation especially in present times when it was faced with various other challenges such as the drought and haze.

Touching upon the discourse, he said the programme involving the private sector, local community and non-governmental organisations was aimed at popularising the civil service.

He added that the programme which had previously been held at INTAN Bukit Kiara, Kuala Lumpur would also be held in the northern region campus in Sungai Petani, Kedah; Kemaman, Terengganu; Kota Kinabalu, Sabah and Kota Samarahan, Sarawak.

"Through this programme, we introduce the youth to successful icons in their chosen fields. We also want to engage them in discussing present and future government policies," he said.
